Prize in Game Theory and Computer Science of the Game Theory Society in Honour of Ehud Kalai

The Prize was established in 2008 in recognition of Ehud Kalai's role in promoting the connection of the two research areas by an endowment of Yoav Shoham.

It is awarded to the person (or persons) who have published the best paper at the interface of game theory and computer science. Preference is given to candidates of age 45 or less at the time of the award, but this is not an absolute constraint.

The Prize consists of a cash award of 2,500 US Dollars, plus travel expenses to attend the Congress.
